Dr Bates is a Senior Chartered Clinical Psychologist at a London NHS Trust, as well as running her own private practice. She carries out assessments and therapy across all aspects of adult mental health, including complex trauma and PTSD, personality disorder, suicide, self-harm, offenders, psychosis, partners of offenders and families. She is experienced in forensic and acute mental health.

She has worked as a Clinical Psychologist for the NHS for 12 years, specialising in Forensic and Acute Mental Health. Her experience includes working with clients in the community, secure environments, custodial settings and inpatient facilities.

FAMILY COURT EXPERTISE

- Dr Bates has over eight years of experience of assessing parents in child protection process and family court proceedings.
- She offers evidence-based assessments of the parent-child attachment relationship and a parent's capacity to develop their attachment relationship.
- She examines the dynamics within families and parental relationships assessing the risk of abuse or violence in the family.
- She carries out specialist assessment of PTSD, Complex Trauma and Dissociation.
- She specialises in clinical and forensic risk assessments including risk of violence or domestic violence, physical harm and neglect.
- Specialist assessments of parents with personality disorder or severe mental health problems.
- Assessment and intervention for adults with learning disabilities or Autistic Spectrum Conditions (ASC).
- She has a working proficiency of Russian language and is sensitive to the cultural context of people from the Former Soviet Union and other Eastern and Central European countries.
