She works with school age children, adolescents as well as their parents with a broad range of mental health, personality and substance misuse problems. She has a particular interest in working with children and parents with attachment difficulties who have experienced trauma, separation or loss. She works therapeutically offering psychological interventions for children, young people and adults.

FAMILY COURT EXPERTISE

- Complex assessments of children, parents and global family functioning.
- Assessments of parental risk including adult mental health problems, substance misuse, violence and domestic violence.
- Specialist assessments of parents with personality disorder and the impact on their parenting.
- Assessment of developmental trauma and the impact of neglect and abuse on children's mental health and behaviour.
