Dr Ward's area of special interest is in the assessment of trauma and PTSD, her experience allows her to have a good understanding of the impact trauma has on mental health and an individual's psychological and social functioning. Dr Ward also has experience of treating a wide range of mental health difficulties including, anxiety, depression, post-traumatic stress disorder, and obsessive compulsive disorder and personality difficulties.
