Dr Jayne Corson is a BPS Chartered and HCPC Registered Senior Forensic Psychologist. She holds a Clinical Lead role within the NHS over-seeing psychological provision covering two London prisons serving a diverse population of offenders with complex presentations. She has held roles within NHS adult forensic mental health, low and medium secure hospitals including acute, rehab and learning disability wards. In addition, she has worked within HM Prison Services across a range of prison settings, including high secure through to open conditions. She has held a post within academia as a university lecturer for BSc and MSc Forensic Psychology programmes, and has worked for the Local Authority, Social Services and probation. Dr Corson provides expert assessments and opinion on offending, violence, personality disorder, sexual offending, domestic violence, firesetting, substance misuse, neurocognitive functioning, mental health, autism, learning disability, trauma, suggestibility, malingering and parental capacity. Her research interests relate to the development of personality disorders, specifically anti-social personality disorder and associated underlying psychological constructs that impact on offending behaviour.

This senior role combines supervision of a team of eight therapists, to facilitate the provision of psychological therapeutic services across two prisons (high secure and remand) within southeast London. In addition, providing complex case clinical consultation to non-psychologist clinical and non-clinical colleagues, with delivering psychological assessment and treatment to prisoners with a variety of clinical presentations across two prisons (high secure and remand) southeast London. Furthermore, developing Oxleas' expanding prison psychological therapies service and refine its emerging model of care to ensure effective and non-excluding delivery of a service that aims to achieve equivalence with community provision. In addition, completing social services directed reports related to child protection cases, undertaking specialist risk assessments, conducting research, delivering training.
