2017 – Present South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust / Clinical Psychologist

Activities include providing training and consultations to social workers and teachers, brief direct therapeutic interventions with young people and foster carer support. I am also the Research Lead for the service and am currently supervising a funded research project and a service evaluation. I provide supervision to a trainee clinical psychologist, facilitate staff reflective groups and coordinate therapeutic network interventions.

Provided direct assessment and therapeutic interventions to children and young people, support to foster carers and adopted parents, coordination and analysis of routine outcome measures, social worker consultations, emergency crisis support and risk management.
