Dr Sarah Dawes is a Forensic Psychologist who qualified in 2014. She is registered with the Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC), Chartered with the British Psychological Society (BPS) and she holds a European standards certification in psychology as well. Sarah specialises in forensic mental health and has substantial experience working with both men and women involved with the criminal justice system, secure psychiatric hospitals and community services. She has worked intensively with those who suffer a range of complex needs and diagnoses including mental illness, personality disorder and learning disabilities. Difficulties experienced by those she has worked with are often complicated by co-occurring problems with substance use, self-harm, trauma and / or serious offence related behaviours (such as violence, arson, stalking and sexual offending). Despite the nature of work Sarah has often been able to develop a positive therapeutic rapport to establish a shared understanding of difficulties experienced and to support a collaborative process.

Sarah currently works as an independent practitioner and is able to carry out formal psychological assessments, including assessments of forensic risk (violence and sexual risk) using structured professional judgment methods, alongside assessments of mental health, trauma, personality disorder and cognitive functioning. By gaining a more in-depth understanding of presenting difficulties it can be of value to provide information for clinical questions raised, inform treatment planning and aid decision making. She is accustomed to writing psychological reports detailing the outcome of assessments and assessment process ensuring the quality is to a high standard.

### 2016 Locum Forensic Psychologist - Leeds and York Partnership Foundation Trust, Newsam Centre, Women's Low Secure Service

• Worked as the primary psychologist for the women's ward within this low secure service. Service users were over the age of 18 and had a history of offending, substance misuse or trauma. Diagnoses included mental illness, personality disorder and learning disability. Support was offered to help reduce risk to self and/ or others and to support them within their recovery journey. The range of work undertaken included offering psychological assessment, individual therapy, family therapy and case consultation. Input at MDT meetings was also required.

### 2015 – 16 Locum Forensic Psychologist - Rotherham Doncaster and South Humber NHS Foundation Trust, Community Learning Disability Outpatient Service

Therapeutic intervention provided for adults with learning disabilities. All corresponding risk
assessments also required to be completed. Presenting problems involved bereavement, trauma
symptoms, attachment issues, sexually inappropriate behaviours and obsessive traits. Consultation
and support was also offered to staff and carers.

### 2015 Locum Forensic Psychologist - Cygnet Hospital Bierley, Male Low Secure Service and Female PICU Services

Worked on the male and female secure wards and in the female PICU service with individuals
diagnosed with mental illness, personality disorder and learning disability. Risk related behaviours
often included violence, sexual offending, substance misuse and self-harm. Took a lead on ensuring
risk assessment (i.e. HCR-20) procedures were in place and were completed and up to date,
undertaking them in a collaborative manner with the patients and care team. Therapeutic
intervention, input at ward rounds and CPA's also provided, identifying appropriate treatment
pathways.

## 2014 – 15 Elysium Healthcare, The Farndon Unit, Women's Low Secure Service (continued working here as a qualified psychologist after working here for <u>six years previous</u> as an assistant and trainee)

 Worked with women diagnosed with personality disorder, mental illness, autistic spectrum disorders, attention deficit and hyperactivity disorder and intellectual disabilities who demonstrated significant risk behaviours towards self and/ or others and supported them to help



aid recovery. In-depth psychological assessments were provided focusing on aspects such as risk, mental disorder and cognitive capacity. The primary focus of interventions within this role was with regards to complex trauma and PTSD, female sexual offending, eating disorders, body dysmorphia, self-harm and aggression.

- Regular contributions were made to MDT meetings and input at management meetings in relation to risk, policy and service provision was also offered.
- On some of the wards a Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) model was in place, whereby support was required to help staff and patients understand this concept and help them implement it. Regular staff supervision was offered alongside psychologically informed training on a variety of subjects was provided on a regular basis.

#### 2009 - 14Forensic Psychologist in Training - Elysium Healthcare, The Farndon Unit, Women's Low **Secure Service**

Provided specialist care for women within a low secure unit detained under the mental health act and assessed as having complex needs. Primary diagnosis was of mental illness or personality disorder often complicated by learning difficulties, offending behaviour and/ or substance misuse. Within this post psychological assessments were completed and therapeutic intervention was provided on a one to one or group basis. MDT meetings were attended regularly alongside providing staff training on aspects such as personality disorder, HCR-20, boundaries, self-harm and suicide. I continued to work within this hospital post qualification.

#### 2010 - 11 Forensic Psychologist in Training - Community Forensic Mental Health Team, Specialist Services, Lincolnshire Partnership Foundation Trust

- Undertook core needs assessments and specialist risk assessments, in addition to specific psychological assessments of mental disorder and personality. These formed the basis of psychological formulations, which aimed to provide a functional link between the persons mental health needs and their risk to others (or self). Formulations were used to inform treatment which were provided by myself, the service or referred on to the most appropriate placement. Client group included both male and females who had offence histories with a range of psychological needs including personality disorder, autistic spectrum disorders and other mental health issues. Whilst the service was provided for adults, there was a need to assess a number of adolescents who were due to transition into adult services within upcoming months.
- Therapeutic intervention focused on addressing underlying personality difficulties, trauma, emotion regulation and work to reduce the risk of sexual offending, violence, stalking and selfharm. In addition to direct clinical work, consultation, training and supervision was provided to NHS staff.

#### 2008 - 09Assistant Psychologist - Elysium Healthcare, The Farndon Unit, Women's Low Secure Service

Psychological assessments were undertaken to aid formulation and identification of appropriate treatment pathways. Individual and group therapy was also offered, whilst ensuring that good communication with the MDT about clients' progress and risk was maintained. Regular audits for the psychology department were also undertaken



### 2006 – 08 Community Mental Health Worker - Rethink, Supported Housing Service

 A person centred approach was used to support males and females with mental disorders living in the community. Support was offered to help maintain daily living skills, enhance interpersonal skills and aid independent living, building effective communication links within the community. Developing care packages and providing input at CPA meetings was also an essential part of the job role.
