Dr Kutereba qualified as a clinical psychologist in 2015, prior to which she had a psychology career in research, completing her PhD in developmental psychopathology in 2010 (something which informed her work as a television presenter for a ground-breaking psychology programme at the same time). Since qualifying as a clinical psychologist, Dr Kutereba has continued her interest in developmental psychology working across a range of child and adolescent settings, particularly with those who are in care, on the edge of care or unable to access mainstream schools or mental health services. Dr Kutereba has worked both for NHS and Local Authority services. Currently Dr Kutereba works in an adolescent inpatient unit, completing assessments and interventions with young people with severe mental health issues, many of whom are in care. Dr Kutereba broad experience enables her to complete the full range of assessments pertinent to family/civil and criminal law.

- Team Manager of Southwark Early Help CAMHS Service
- Non-clinical duties included management and supervision of CAMHS specialists across all localities of Southwark, ensuring high level of quality and consistency across all localities
- Developing, implementing, and assessing impact of Mental Health Strategy
- Clinical duties included holding a small caseload of young people who were not accepted into Tier 3 CAMHS but considered too high risk or complex to be managed by a single CAMHS specialist in the community.

Oct 2014 – Nov 2015 Specialist Clinical Psychologist, Anna Freud Centre

- The Schools Outreach Team is a service run by the Anna Freud Centre
- The service runs as an 'alternative' to CAMHS provision; actively engaging those for whom accessing traditional CAMHS would be unlikely
- Assessment and treatment of children and families with a high level of complexity and need
- Families typically have disengaged from services, and so assertive outreach together with a high level of creativity and flexibility is needed
- Managed a large case load, and the pace at which the schools required me to work

Oct 2010 – Oct 2014 Trainee Clinical Psychologist, Camden & Islington NHS Trust

- Clinical training, (including maternity leave)
- Third Year Placement - Attachment & Trauma Team - Tier 4 CAMHS providing assessment and intervention to children and young people (0-16) and their families where there is a complex background of abuse, neglect, or trauma, particularly when there is also a question around possible neurodevelopmental disability
- Second Year Placements 1) Community Rehabilitation Team, Mile End Hospital - Worked with adults with a primary diagnosis of physical health conditions (e.g., MS), or clients who had experienced a brain injury or age-related cognitive decline

Oct 2009 – Oct 2010 Assistant Psychologist, Whittington NHS Trust

- National Clinical Assessment and Treatment service, Whittington NHS Trust
- Tier 4 service working with children and young people displaying sexually harmful behaviour
- Conducted psychological assessments, drafting reports, and assisting with foster-carer interviews
- Involved in the development of a CBT-based intervention and in training professionals in using a treatment manual that was developed by Dr Eamon McCrory, my supervisor in the service.

Oct 2007 – Oct 2010 PhD Candidate, University College London

- My PhD was fully funded by the Economic and Social Research Council (1+ 3 Studentship) and investigated Individual Differences Attention and Emotion Processing in Conduct Disorder in Children and Psychopathic Traits in Adults
- This involved advanced experimental design, psychometric testing of children with conduct problems in schools, statistical analyses, and writing up research for publication.

Nov 2006 – March 2007 Television Presenter, BBC & Objective Productions

- “The People Watchers”, BBC and Objective Productions
- TV series shown on BBC in 2008
- I was chosen by the BBC to present this 20 part TV series as a Psychologist
- At the time of production, the show was ground-breaking as it was (and currently remains) the longest TV series dedicated to Psychology
- My role extended further than presenting as I was heavily involved in the development of the content of the series, creating formats for experiments that would translate well onto screen, but that would also maintain scientific integrity
- The series received a very good review in “The Psychologist”
