Medical Lead for an ongoing redesign of adult community services. I stepped down from this role in July 2018.

I am an Appraiser for the Trust (an Appraiser reviews the progress of other doctors annually to ensure they are maintaining GMC standards and other aspects of Good Medical Practice) and the Appraiser Representative on our Revalidation Steering Group. I am the Line Manager and Educational Supervisor for one trainee doctor. I have a particular interest in training issues; through my personal development (PDP) I keep up to date and take my Educational Supervisor role seriously. My most enjoyable training interest is in relation to teaching interview skills and this is an area I have research interest and experience.

Previously I have occupied the role of College Tutor (for 5 years) and as such have experience with teaching and training issues and management of a group of trainees. I occupied the position of the chair of our Local Negotiating Committee (LNC) for 2 years and have experience in Industrial Relations Issues and experience of involvement with the British Medical Association (BMA) and their Industrial Relations Officers (IROs).
