Resolution/Home Treatment Teams, and liaise with inpatients services/primary care liaison service.

RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

Measurement & assessment of pain reduction six months following combined scarf akin's osteotomies +/- 2/3 toe correction for hallux valgus. (2014). Journal of Foot and Ankle Research. - A combined Scarf Akin osteotomy with or without 2/3 toe is an effective procedure for the correction of symptomatic Hallux valgus foot deformity at 6 months. It permits early weight bearing of the treated extremity and it requires exact pre-operative planning and strict adherence to the operative technique if pain is to be effectively eliminated and the HRQOL restored with above satisfactory results.

The Possible Retroviral Associations with Chronic Fatigue Syndrome (2010) – This study reviews the literature to evaluate the existing and emerging viral hypotheses related to the Chronic Fatigue Syndrome, with the aim of establishing a possible relationship that would provide the basis for which appropriate care and treatment can be offered in the future. For this purpose, the initiative of developing the first tissue bank, at Cardiff University, for donation in the United Kingdom was proposed, and is in progress.

Determinants of Reproductive Health in Women living in Igbo-Ora, Nigeria (2006) – This study is a cross-sectional study that looks at the factors that influence women's health in a town called Igbo-Ora, which is known to have one of the highest twinning rates in the world. The aim is to give a more insightful approach in understanding the reproductive factors in women within the region.



TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Since beginning clinical training in West Africa, I have had the privilege and huge opportunity of training medical students and allied staff (as well as school children on public health grounds, inclusive of preventable tropical diseases), involving practical teaching sessions on intravenous line setting, urethral catheterization, suturing and other bedside procedures; and I have also been involved with their assessments as well. Furthermore, whilst working in Hull, I trained medical students, who currently are House Officers, themselves.

The content of teaching sessions, since beginning practice in the United Kingdom, has included bed side teachings and case-based discussions on common emergencies, with a focus to preparing finalists to practice effectively as safe doctors, bearing the minimum requirements, as set out by the esteemed General Medical Council, with regards full registration.

I was recently recognized by the Nuffield Department of Clinical Medicine, at the University of Oxford, for teaching finalist students. Since, starting core training in Psychiatry, I have also had the privilege of teaching medical and nursing students and have undergone assessment for teaching as well as relevant training.
