I have been a Consultant Psychiatrist for over 20 years. I am duly registered in acute general psychiatry and older adults. I have been involved in planning, reorganisation and reshaping services in my area of South West Surrey & NE Hants. I was instrumental in



relocating services from the old mental hospital to a more modern setting. This involved restyling and reshaping the service as well as resources mapping out.

I was appointed in 1989 as a Consultant Psychiatrist in acute General Psychiatry. I covered West Surrey and North East Hants for a few years, and I was responsible for all psychiatric pathology that often encountered in working age adults. I managed a large pool of psychiatric patients with a variety of psychiatric pathologies. I dealt with psychosis, neurosis, drug addiction, personality difficulties and mental health problems relating to stress and situational reactions including post-traumatic stress disorder. Since the mid-nineties I have taken an interest in organic psychiatry but I have continued to take interest in working age adults and was actually engaged in managing both groups. I have held in the last 20 years many position administrative academic and clinical positions.
