- Formally advising the court about major psychiatric issues (including fitness to plead).
- Initiating and undertaking Mental Health Act assessments, where necessary.
 Making formal recommendations for these.
- Contributing to formal business meetings between various teams and organisations within the court.
- o Lead formal teaching sessions for other members of my team.
- o Attending pan-London Court Liaison & Diversion focus groups.



Outside of my clinical psychiatrist role for the NHS, I carry out independent expert witness work for both courts.

- My responsibilities within my recent prison role (also part time for CNWL NHS Foundation Trust; from February 2017 to May 2018) included:
- Overseeing the care of the psychiatric patients within the prison's Healthcare Unit.
- o Clinical Leadership to prison clinical mental health team.
- o Initiating treatment for prisoners suffering form mental illness (including prescribing medication and referring to our team of psychologists).
- Regular assessments/courts reports for a number of courts and solicitors;
 regarding recommendations for disposal (including formal transfer to hospital under the Mental Health Act 1983/2007) for prisoners.
