# WORK HISTORY

# 2021 – Present Senior Clinical Psychologist and Clinical lead for the Walsall Family Safeguarding Adult Mental Health Team

- Developing a new service for parents whose children are open to Children's Services. Developing pathways and support for this vulnerable and complex population of adults.
- Providing management support and supervision to the mental health practitioners and psychologists in the team.
- Developing specialist mental health assessments for these parents identifying their mental health needs and also the parenting needs.
- Working closely with child Social Workers and Adult Practitioners to provide a holistic package of support for parents with the overall aim of reducing the number of children becoming accommodated.
- Providing bespoke psychological mental health consultations to Social Workers identifying the mental health needs of the parents and agreeing a package of support.



- Regular liaison with NHS and Local Authority commissioners and providing outcome data and performance reviews of the project.
- Providing specialist formulations and interventions to this group of vulnerable adults including
  offering individual therapeutic support and group support.
- Providing specialist attachment based parenting programmes.
- Regular training and supervision to Social Workers and family support workers.
- Working collaboratively with colleagues to develop a trauma informed approach.

#### 2018 – 21 Senior Clinical Psychologist and Clinical lead for the Unaccompanied Asylum-Seeking Children (UASC) well-being project in Wolverhampton

- Developing pathways for all Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Children (UASC) referred into the CAMHS service.
- Providing a specific psychological assessment of all UASC in particular assessing for significant mental health difficulties e.g. post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD)
- Offering specialist interventions for this group of young people in accordance with the NICE guidelines, in particular EMDR therapy.
- Working closely alongside colleagues in the Local Authority and Voluntary sector to ensure a holistic package of support for these vulnerable young people
- Providing regular outcome reports of the project to commissioners and the Local Authority
- Completing assessments for court supporting these young people in their asylum application
- Providing training and consultation to social workers and workers at the Refugee and Migrant Centre.
